

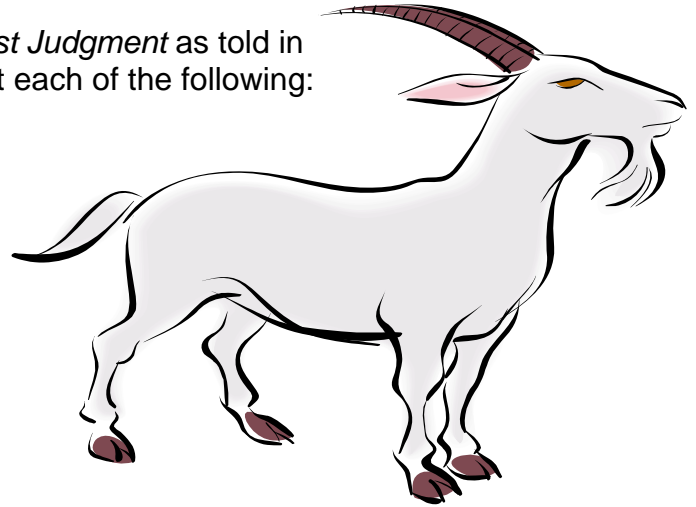
An assessment task:

1. **Imagine** you are present at the *Last Judgment* as told in the parable. Write **3 sentences** about each of the following:

- What you **see**
- What you **smell**
- What you **hear**
- What you **touch** (feel)
- What you **taste**
- How you are **feeling**

2. There is a lot of artwork based on the Last Judgment (for example Michelangelo did a section in the Sistine Chapel, as well as artists such as Bosch, Pieter Pourbus and Jan Paulus Maly). Some used the analogy of the sheep and goats: others didn't. You are now going to **create** your own piece

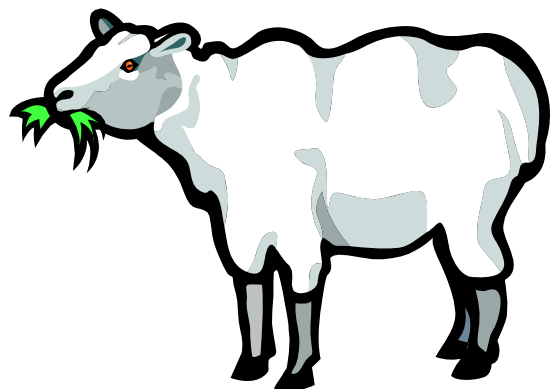
entitled either '**The Last Judgment**', '**Judging what is right and wrong**' or '**Who is the judge?**' To do this you will need to draw on your understanding of the Parable of the Sheep and the Goats and your own thoughts about sin, right and wrong and God's judgement. To create your artwork you have a choice from charcoal, coloured chalks or images cut or torn from magazines and newspapers.

## The Parable of the Sheep and Goats. (Matthew 25: 31-46)



### The Final Judgement

#### A Parable by Jesus

“When the Son of Man comes as King and all the angels with him, he will sit on his royal throne, and the people will gather together. He will divide them in to two separate groups (just as a Shepherd separates the sheep from the goats).

He will put the good people on his right hand side and the others on his left. Then he will say to the people on his right, ‘Come to the kingdom which has been prepared for you since the creation of the world. I was hungry and you fed me, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, I was sick and you took care of me and in prison you visited me’.

The good people will then answer, “ When, Lord, did all these things happen?” The Lord will reply, ‘I tell you, whenever you did this for anyone, you did it for me’.

Then he will say to those on his left, ‘Away from me, you are under a curse. Go to the eternal fire, which has been prepared by the devil and his angels! You never fed me; neither did you give me a drink. You would not even visit me in prison’.

They will answer him, ‘When Lord did we see you hungry, thirsty, or in prison?’

The King will reply, ‘I tell you whenever you refused to help a person who needed it, you refused to help me.’

These, then, will be sent off to eternal punishment, and the good people (the righteous) will go to eternal Life.”
