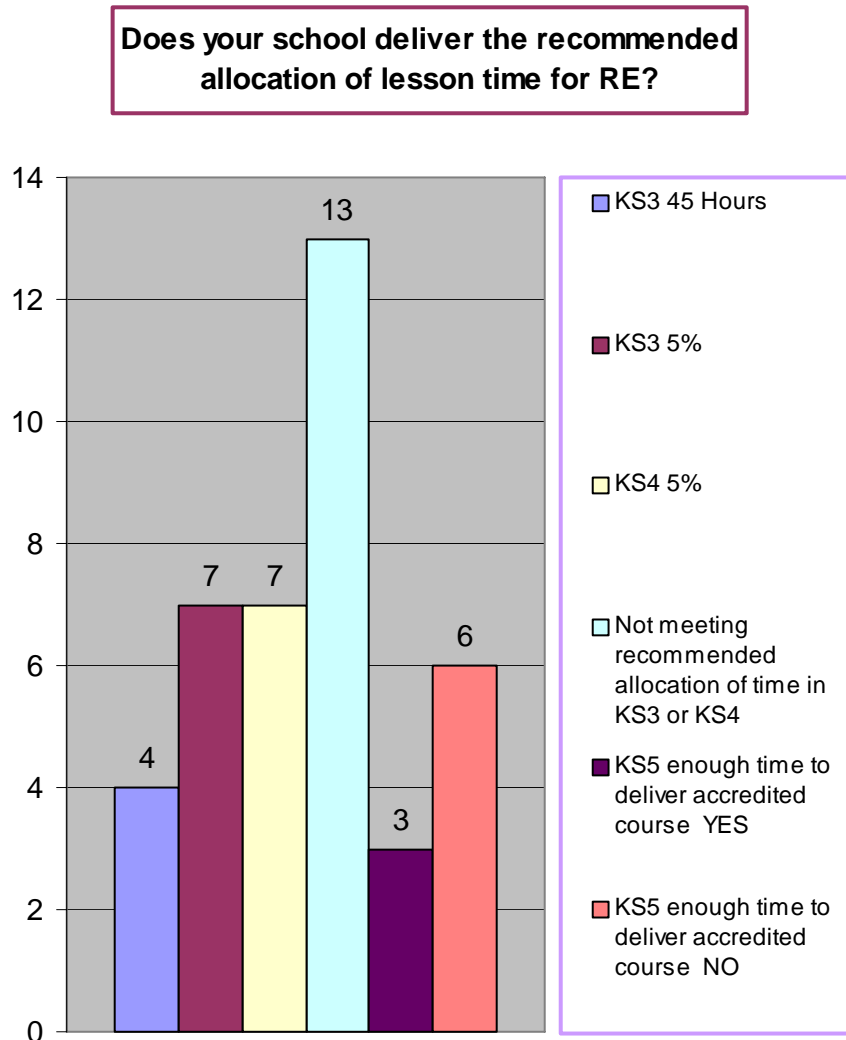


Provision of Religious Education and Collective Worship Secondary Questionnaire Analysis

A total of 21 (of the 29) Secondary schools in Cambridgeshire County returned completed questionnaires. Parkside Federation submitted one return representing both Parkside Community College and Coleridge Community College and is represented as one school in the figures above. The information provided has been analysed and is represented below in the following charts.

QUESTION 1)

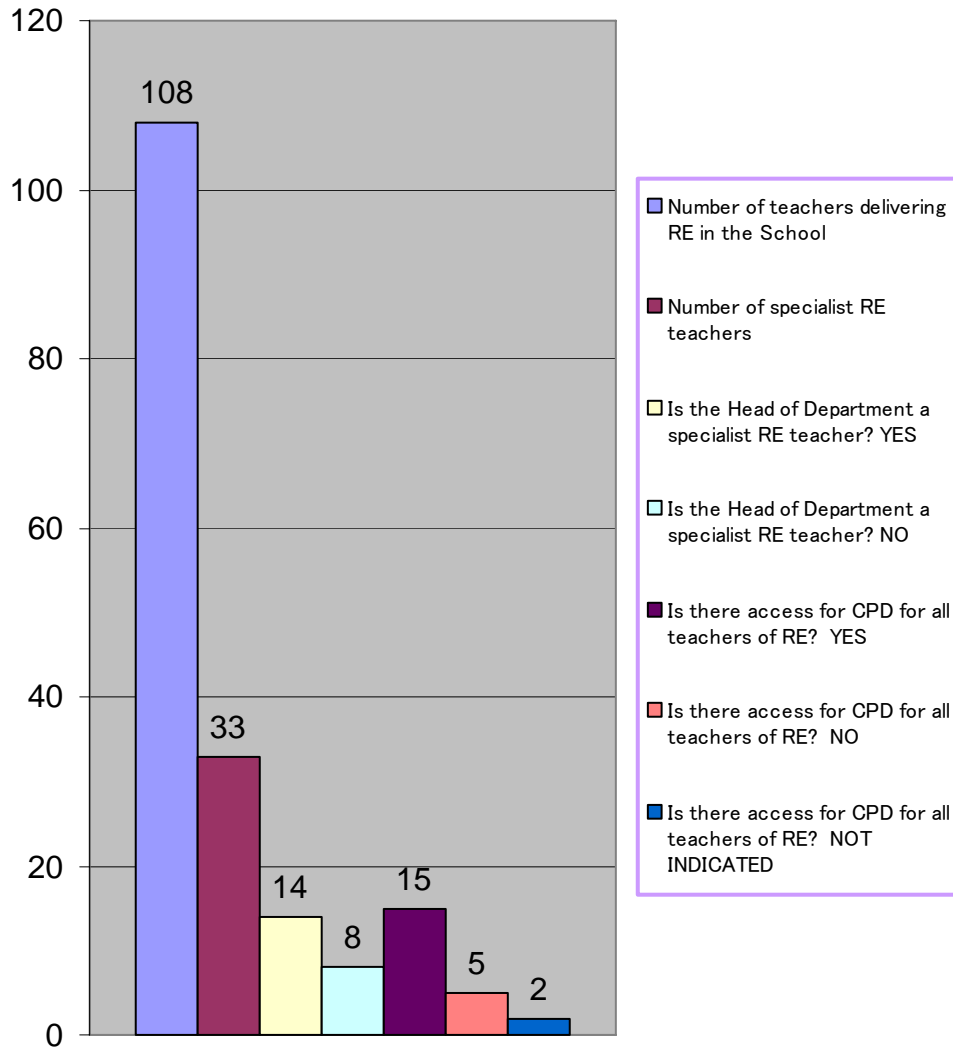


At KS5, 13 of the schools within the County offer sixth form college education and 6 of these completed a questionnaire.

Some schools stated they are not delivering the recommended lesson time indicated but are close to achieving it.

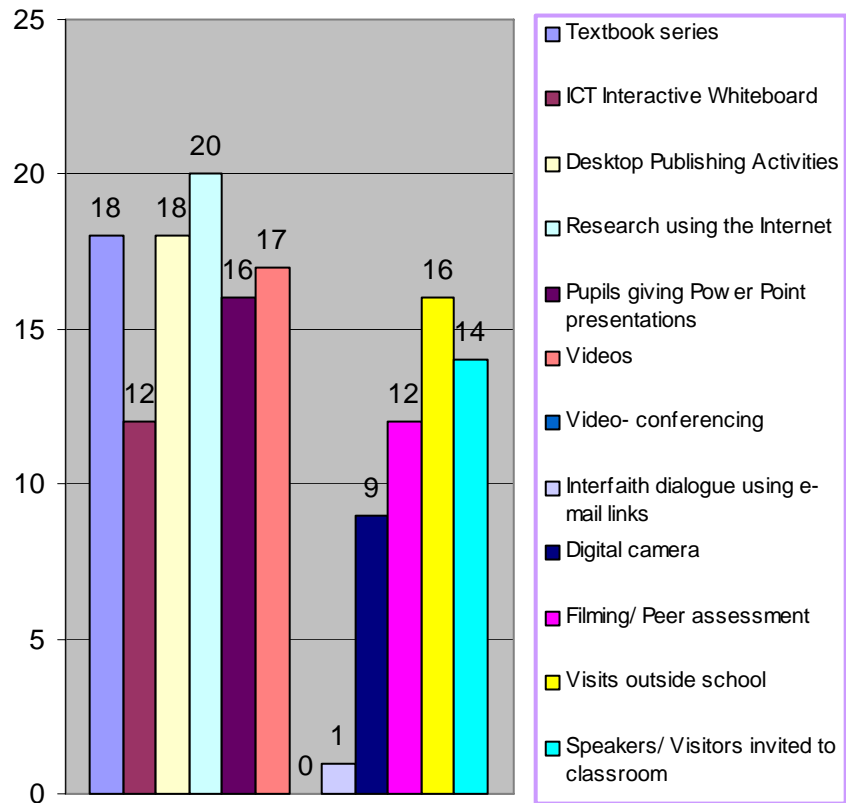

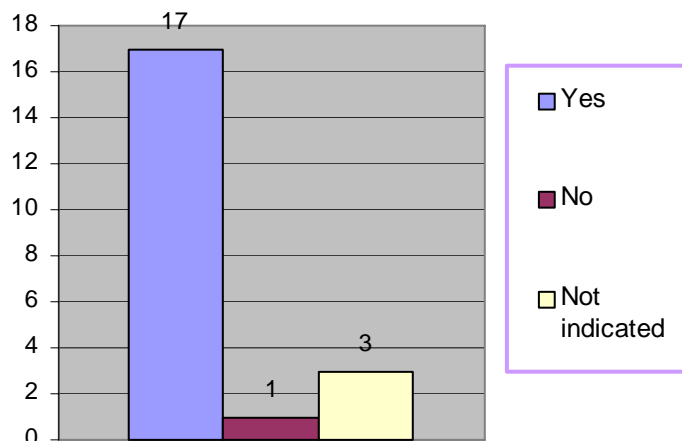
What resources do you use in teaching KS3 at your school?



NB - None of the schools that returned questionnaires use video-conferencing as a KS3 resource.

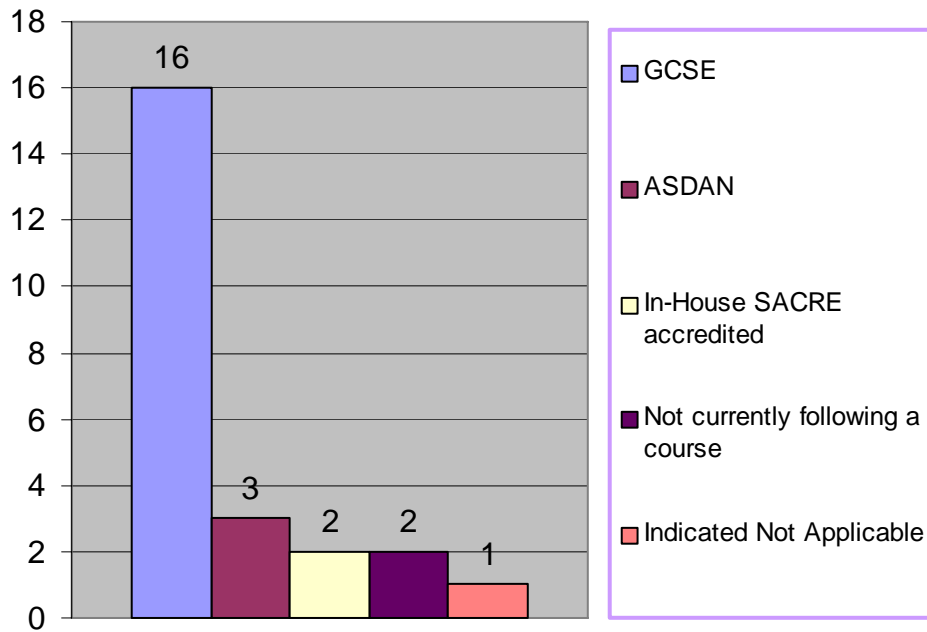
QUESTION 4)

The Agreed Syllabus now requires ALL students to follow an accredited course at KS4 - which one does your school follow?

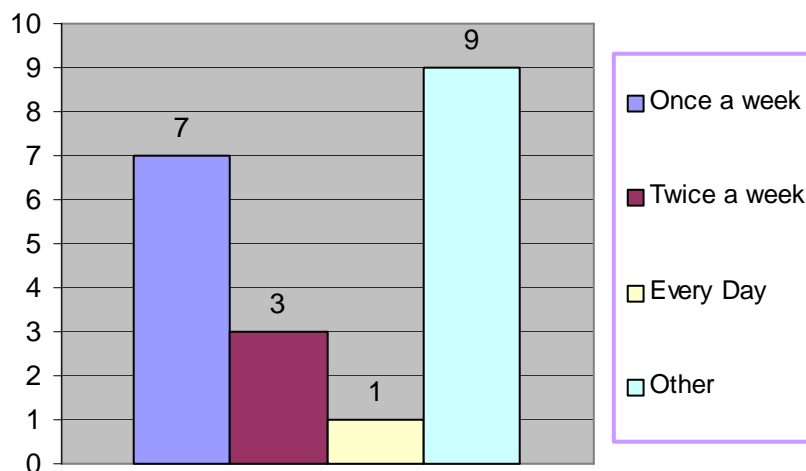


3 schools of the schools that responded are following more than accredited course.
